This is not about bad behaviour, but about the unproductive classroom behaviours exhibited (not exclusively) by children or students with one of six learning disabilities - dyslexia, dyspraxia, attention deficit disorder/attention deficit hyperactivity disorders, Asperger syndrome/autistic spectrum disorder, physical disabilities and speech and language disorders. It has suggestions on how to address these behaviours- including problems such as staying on task, inability to work on group tasks and failure to seek help when needed. The recommendations in this book for classroom management of these behaviours are mostly at early levels of intervention. It looks at management in three stages: identification and monitoring, 'What to do on Monday' strategies, and an overview of some of the theories that explain the underlying factors that have contributed to the behaviours and can provide the skills to deal with them.

The first section is a literature review of Australian, British and American research, followed by a qualitative analysis of data on carer characteristics, using the Australian Census of Population and Housing (2006), the Survey of Disability Ageing and Carers (2003), and the HILDA Survey (2005). The report also presents findings from focus groups with 65 young carers, on the benefits and costs of caring and their support needs, as well as focus groups with policy makers and service providers.
